Susanne Brent introduced our speaker, Isabella Maldonado, by telling of a blockbuster update on her book, THE CIPHER. This book had just been optioned by Netflix, which plans to make a Feature Film starring Jennifer Lopez. That certainly got everyone's attention!

Ms. Maldonado spent over two decades working in law enforcement and has been a great student of the human psyche. She says she draws upon her knowledge but does not want the burden of writing about real people. For instance, CIPHER was conceived after being in DC during the rampage of the Beltway Sniper. Seeing the explosion of fear, social media, and news coverage, she began to wonder if someone wanted to terrorize the whole country, what would that look like?

Her writing process is to make a loose outline of the beginning, middle, and end. She does not sequester herself to write, her husband and son can interrupt at any time. She said the most fortuitous thing she did was to attend a book festival called Thriller Fest. She had the opportunity to pitch her book and an editor loved it. She was offered a 3-book deal at the festival. She touted book festivals as invaluable but says it's best to have a completed product.

Member Spotlight



Throughout her professional career as an educational psychologist, and as a mother, Karen Shiffman Lateiner, M.Ed., has been an advocate for children at-risk for academic failure, bullying, and mental health challenges. Coming to terms with her own child's gender transition in the mid-1990s, and then her child's untimely death, motivated her to write her memoir as a vehicle for shedding light on issues facing transgender people.

Timeless Dance: A Story of Change and Loss, her debut book, is a compelling memoir about life, death, gender change, acceptance, advocacy, and coping within the family, the community, and the world. It is a well told story of generational challenges and reflections on

life altering events; a skillfully woven mix of narrative, prose, poetry, and letters. A page turner by many accounts, *Timeless*

Dance illuminates issues not often contemplated, especially those related to transgender and gender non-conforming individuals.

Timeless Dance opened numerous doors for Karen to speak about Understanding Gender Diversity: LGBTQ+ and Beyond. Over the past three years since publishing, she has given numerous presentations at a variety of venues throughout the country, both in-person and via Zoom.
