

September Speaker

Speaker Chair Susanne Brent introduced Allison Brennan, a New York Times bestselling author. She's written over 40 thrillers. You can preview her book series in order by accessing the link <u>https://www.allisonbrennan.com</u>.

She gave the group excellent advice on writing. She's a mother of five and discovered during a maternity leave that she needed more stimulation and read seventy-seven books. She had written over 100 books but never finished them. She says that if you want to write, you'll find the time. In her case, she gave up cleaning and TV. She also said to find the system that works for you and to stick to it. She has an agent, but she indicated that small presses don't care if you don't have an agent. She recommends that you research for an agent at <u>https://www.agentquery.com/</u>.

Ms. Brennan is not a fan of self-publishing. She initially wrote five books in two years. She said she wrote sloppy copies to get the story out. She recommends the book *Self Editing for Fiction Writers* to do self-editing. Ms. Brennan writes between 2000-3000 words a day and self-edits.

Ms. Brennan called herself a college drop-out who began writing as a child. She joined Romance Writers of America and the group was an inspiration for her to get on track. She recommended Stephen King's book *On Writing.* She told the group that once published she had to stick to her audience who didn't appreciate her moving to a different genre and recommends using a pseudonym if you do that.

Ms. Brennan also recommends that authors have a web page with basic information and is easy to navigate. She has a newsletter that she sends out quarterly. Maintain a social media with a Facebook page you post daily. Avoid controversial topics in your author's page.

Ms. Brennan said to set goals and reward yourself. Every time she finishes a book she rewards herself—she bought the whole season of Deadwood and binged watched the series. She writes three to five books every two years.

The meeting adjourned at 2:10 p.m.

Holiday Salon/Write On Writers (WOW)



Parking may be awkward: Joe will direct people where to park, either their lane or their neighbor's.


