March Speaker

In March, we welcome Brian Freeman!

Brian Freeman is a *New York Times* and *USA Today* bestselling author of more than two dozen psychological thrillers, including the Jonathan Stride series and multiple popular stand-alone novels. He was also selected by the Robert Ludlum estate to take over Ludlum's iconic Jason Bourne series.

Since 2005, Freeman has sold books in 46 counties and 24 languages. He was an Edgar Award finalist in 2021 for his novel THE DEEP, DEEP SNOW, and his novel SPILLED BLOOD won the award for Best Hardcover Novel in the ITW Thriller Awards. Kirkus Reviews names his novels among their Best Mysteries and Thrillers of the year in both 2020 and 2021 (for THE BOURNE EVOLUTION and INFINITE). He is a two-time winner of the Minnesota Book Award.



All of his books are available in audio editions. His novels THE BONE HOUSE and SEASON OF FEAR were both named finalists for the Audie Award for Best Audiobook in Thriller/Suspense.

Freeman's writing has been praised by critics and bestselling authors alike, including Michael Connelly, Nelson DeMille, Jeffery Denver, and Lisa Gardner. "A master of psychological suspense," Gardner said of Freeman. London's *Daily Mail* called Freeman, "up there with Harlan Coben in the psychological crime stratosphere."

Guest Speaker

Susanne Brent introduced our speaker, <u>Melissa Pritchard</u>. She spoke about the aspects of writing and asked the group to list the impactful five books each attendee remembered. What made these books special? What was the common thread in those five books? What moved you? She then said to eliminate all but one book. She asked if you only had one year left to live and only one book to write, what would it be?

Melissa said that the biggest obstacle to writing is procrastination. Writers have a fear of failure, so we allow things to pile up. Recognize when you're stalling.

Her remedies for procrastination include the following:

- Show Up! Find that hour in the day and write.
- Don't talk about what you're writing until you can show the finished product.
- Maintain a physical space and choose the time to write, morning, afternoon, or evening.
- Limit your participation in the Writing Industry. Ask yourself if you really need to study under one more teacher.
- For inspiration read great stuff. Study the author and take apart the writing and learn from that.
- Read poetry, the classics, avant-garde, plays. Did they win prizes and what kind?

Melissa also said that the writer is the Truthteller and High Priest(ess). Allow yourself to be vulnerable. Ask yourself, what secrets are you keeping from yourself and feel the answer. After questions to the speaker, the meeting closed at 2:13 p.m.

The WOW group followed with eight participants.
