The Page to Stage Journey

Note: The Arizona State Poetry Society (ASPS) sponsored workshop facilitator Ben Gardea for the 2023 Blackberry Peach National Poetry Championship. He finished in the top 10.

Poets across the valley are earnestly exploring ways to perform their art in an authentically compelling way. Be it at open mics or competitive slams, any poet can affirm the inherent challenge in bridging the gap between a page of poetry and a performance of poetry. After all, poetry is an incredibly nuanced and dynamic art form in that even the seemingly most minor of modifications can drastically alter the energy of the delivery.

In this 1:00-3:00 workshop (October 7th-Tempe and 14th-Tucson), participants will learn the fundamental techniques of delivering their poem in a compelling way. These sessions will be interactive in nature to encourage collaborative energy and ensure engaged participation. Participants will explore the concepts of vocal range and diction in addition to stage presence and choreography.

Katie Sarah Zale, TAPS President (Tucson branch of ASPS) will lead these two workshops in anticipation of and preparation for the January **2024 ASPS Annual Conference** where volunteers from the workshops will demonstrate their learning side-by-side with SLAM poets, i.e., competitive spoken word artists.

The Journey—In conjunction with the workshop series and January 2024 conference, Katie will lead and organize a regional slam tournament, such that the winner will qualify for the Blackberry Peach National Poetry Championship. The only requirement to enter the regional slam tournament is to become a member of ASPS. Ultimately, the goal is to support poets through their journey, from page to stage and beyond. In doing so, we establish our legacy and inspire new generations of Arizona poets to come.
