



Voyage of Life. Unpublished. The Voyage of Life story is told as the Robert Cole Voyage of Life paintings are described: Childhood, Youth, Manhood, and Old Age. The paintings are a metaphor for SEAN'S life. In early manhood he thinks MADDY, his one true love, has left him for another man and spends his life wondering what happened.

Shadow in the Night. Unpublished. Twelve days before Christmas LUKE loses his job and his wife is called



away to care for her dying mother. Left alone at Christmas time, of the major traumatic life events—being fired from a job, fearing divorce, plotting murder, the death of a family member and jail time, any one of which can threaten your very existence—he faces them all.

Aaron's War. 2018 Arizona Author's Association runner-up fiction book of the year. Posted on Amazon. Aaron's War is about a young soldier who can't kill, overwhelmed by the horrors of war, conflicted by religion and ravaged by memories, makes the painful choice to leave his wife and child. Later, when he confronts the German soldier who spared his life, he faces a life decision that could take him back home.

A Love Divided by Time. 2019 finalist unpublished by Arizona Author's Association book of the year. Recently posted on Amazon. FORREST AND ALLIE believed they found love in a previous life and being born again was a game of hide and seek to find each other in plain sight, seeking their better halves, united and whole. When tragedy strikes, Forrest makes a pact to find her killer, raise their daughter, and find peace by joining her in the ever after.

The Attic. Unpublished. The Attic is an emotional story about facing adversity and overcoming loss. When BYRON KELLY's wife dies, he faces assault charges and a lawsuit, and flees to Chicago and assumes a new identity. When Byron Kelly becomes a whistleblower on the run from the FBI he hides out in the attic of a dying old man, HENRY STEELE. Byron cares for the old man and learns he is estranged from his daughter over the death of her mother, his wife, because of family secrets he has kept from her.


