Jenny Bilskie-Smith, Vice-President, opened the meeting which was held at Gallagher's. After announcements and members' news, she introduced our speaker, Ryder Lyne, whose presentation provided the attendees with the business components of authorship.

Ryder gave statistics on preparing the book for publication by providing estimates on formatting, cover design, marketing, and advertising. See the handout she provided for budgeting for a book launch. She also provided a reader/editor comparison chart and encouraged using a development editor and copy editor for your book. Ryder wrapped the session with best budgeting practices for a book launch that sets realistic goals and involves planning for expenses. She closed the presentation with a list to follow for a do-it-yourself book launch.
