

This community center is located in the city's picturesque Los Olivos Park. The 23,000 sq. ft. center offers a fitness center, dance/exercise room, billiards room, meeting space, an art gallery . . . and now us!

Our meeting on September 21 will be from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. We determined that the earlier time will work best for our club. It gives us the opportunity to meet with other members afterwards for lunch or nosh at a nearby restaurant, if desired. - **Kindle Create:** A free formatting tool offered by Amazon that allows you to format your manuscript for Kindle e-readers and tablets.
- **Vellum:** A premium formatting software that allows you to create professional-looking eBooks and print books with ease.
- Canva: A free design tool that allows you to create book covers, promotional graphics, and other design elements for your self-published book.


