November Meeting Minutes

President, Cindi Reiss opened the meeting at 10:37 AM after a lively gathering around the coffee and charcuterie breakfast assortment provided by Arizona Author's Association (AAA) member, Penny Orloff. Thank you, Penny, for the awesome medley. Arizona Author's Association: <u>ArizonaAuthors.org</u>

After welcoming AAA members and introducing the guests and new members, Cindi presented the upcoming PWC events that will kick start 2025 and a year-long plan of activities for our 2026 Centennial Celebration event.

Navissa talked about the Essay/Poetry Contest themed *Formidable Women*. Contestants can begin submitting in January 2025 on Submittable. Details will appear in the newsletter, on Facebook, and the PWC website.

Cindi informed guests and members of December's Meeting which will be a *Holiday Salon*. Everyone can participate in a reading, a skit, a poem, or even a piece of music. Look at the Newsletter for details on how to enter your specialty. She also encouraged members to submit their bios and pictures for a page on our website to our Social Media Coordinator Ilsa Manning

We are also looking for social media assistance and a club secretary.

Today's event was a joint meeting with AAA, who provided breakfast, and the speaker Danielle Hampson Executive Producer - TheAuthorsShow.com. Mark Walker, who is an AAA member, spoke about membership with AAA which has 235 members. He talked about the *Give a Book—Get a Smile* program which allows authors to provide books to groups that don't have access, such as André House and other centers.

Guest Speaker

Mark then introduced Danielle Hampson- the founder and Executive Producer of "The Authors Show[®]" the forerunner of podcasts (https://wnbnetworkwest.com). Her program was the first to interview authors and feature them on her show.

Danielle talked about Authorship as a business. Published authors must market their book if they want to promote it. Consult your CPA for information on forming a small business and a tax advantage. She then gave a summary of how book sales generally go: 50% are sold in bookstores. If you only use Amazon, you're depriving yourself of sales. Bookstores are gathering places for people to enjoy coffee, wine, etc. In the U.S. bookstores sell 35% of books, China 12-15%, Germany 8-10%, and the U.K. 6-8%. The five countries sell between 60-74% of the books distributed worldwide. So, you have to advertise for other markets to pick up your book to sell.



In reality, to sell 200 books, you need to have around 200,000 people who know about it. That's where the Internet comes in. Even if you have a publisher that markets your book, you have to utilize multiple platforms.



- (1) A website with links to make it easy to get to your book. Use it to share a chapter from the book. Be flexible and reach out.
- (2) Sign up with LinkedIn to insert information and updates about yourself and your book(s).
- (3) Do interviews, audio videos, talk shows. These add to your credibility as an expert. Once you have a video or have been part of a podcast, you can use it over and over again. Post it on your website. The concept of repetition adds exposure. If attending a book signing or event, sell your book at the back of the room.
- (4) Do interviews for exposure to your work which will give you a better chance to get discovered.
- (5) Do homework. Research shows, platforms, and hosts to make sure they do good interviews and that you're not just a filler for another show.
- (6) Book cover essential to marketing.
- (7) Formatting and editing to ensure that your book has no mistakes. The bottom line, focus on what you can do and hire others to do the other jobs, such as designing a book cover and editing.

Danielle encouraged authors to apply to "The Authors Show®" by filling out the application.

Her program has 7000 authors globally, does 35 interviews weekly, hundreds of postings on social media weekly, and no cost involved for being on the show. They produce a 24-hour broadcast on the internet. If you want a copy of your podcast, she offers three tiers: (1) A copy of your podcast that you can post yourself for \$129; (2) They archive your podcast and rebroadcast it within 6 months for \$349; (3) \$599 for the full year.

The questions and answer period could have gone on for another hour. This was an outstanding presentation that authors and potential authors needed to hear and take notes on.

Cindi closed the meeting at 12:06 PM.

These will be narrowed down to a final ten that go to the final judges. We will determine who will be the judges in all of these tiers.

We will start work on the *Roaring 20s* Party and Fundraiser for March 2025. Winners of the contest will be announced. We're also having a Silent Auction that Navissa will be heading. We'll be looking for vintage 1926s items for auction. Remember we have three vintage typewriters we'll be advertising for the auction. Bernadette will make a jpeg calendar of events to post on Facebook.

PWC Piece of History

As we get ready for our centennial in 2026, we look back at some of the influential members that made our club thrive.

When I joined PWC in 2004, Mabel Leo was installed as president and thus began my journey into this lively social writing group that I have been proud to be a part of ever since. Mabel's presidency lasted six years, instead of a usual two-year term as she led the club with her feisty spirit and determination. She was an advocate for the club at fairs, events, etc. and brought us into the world of technology as she secured our first website.

She was the impetus behind our 80th Anniversary celebration as we wrote the children's book, *The Wall*, in 2006, a 'chain story' with each chapter written by another author. Though she wrote in many genres, she is best known for her books about Jack Durant, the infamous restaurateur who had ties to the mob and remained a mystery man until Mabel's skills brought him to life. The books were adapted into an ariZoni Award (Phoenix's Tonys) winning play and a movie.

In 2016, Mabel was honored by the Arizona State Senate and her books placed in their library.

She welcomed members into the PWC fold with her never-ending smile and shared her expertise and encouragement with writers of every level. Her leadership lured me into becoming Speaker Chair, then Vice -President, succeeding her as president as she shared with me her effervescent ways of managing a club filled with diverse talent. Mabel represented the best of Phoenix Writers Club, a social, engaging, learning place for writers and readers of all genres.

Even during the last years of her life on her journey with dementia, she kept her positive spirit, bringing life to the room when she walked in. She continued to tell stories of the characters she had met in her life, another book in the making. Her joyous vitality will be with PWC always.



- Scrivener: A writing software that allows you to organize and structure your writing, making it easier to format and prepare your book for self-publishing.
- Kindle Create: A free formatting tool offered by Amazon that allows you to format your manuscript for Kindle e-readers and tablets.
- Vellum: A premium formatting software that allows you to create professional-looking eBooks and print books with ease.
- **Canva:** A free design tool that allows you to create book covers, promotional graphics, and other design elements for your self-published book.
