Speaker

11:15 – 12:30 PM Guest speaker Janna Lopez, author of *The Bypass to Brilliance*, founder of Poetic Intelligence, 2023 Santa Fe Poet Laureate Ambassador. https://jannalopez.com/

Highlights from Janna's presentation:

Why are we stuck as writers? Nobody likes to create then get stuck in not creating. I can help you get unstuck, unlearn what you have learned about writing. I went on a path of unlearning for many years, and that's what I teach. We have a deep desire to be heard, to tell our stories but we can become bogged down. I work with people to help them unlearn so they can create. Writing is the only cultural currency with true value.

My method is "Bypass to Brillance," a way to acknowledge your ideas that are formed from 100,000 of moments in your life. Writing is the only form of expression that comes with expectations. I've been a poet all my life. But not until finishing my MFA at 52 was I considered a poet. I'm thrilled to announce I have accepted the position of Inaugural Poet in Residence of Creighton Univ (international platform).

I've seen people's lives change when writing from a place of inspiration.

- 1. Writing is a relationship. Things you give to a relationship: communication, time, patience, empathy, trust, honesty, grace, kindness, forgiveness, hope, humor.
- 2. Writing is a conversation with yourself. Step in. Step out. Ongoing. Active. Not active. Your creative expression should not be burdensome, such as practicing daily pages.
- 3. Writing is an Invitation, not an Expectation. Welcome. Choice. A possibility. Words make a difference. Expectations rob a writer of any joy from writing.



4. Write for an audience of ONE – You. Process of writing gives you something you need.

I use Invitations not Prompts. She presented a short activity that showed members how a shift can occur in the intentionality of their writing (exercise Candle and exercise Gold Ring). Use exercises to connect to your you-ness.

Two things are true: people will not like your writing and people will like your writing.



I want to help writers figure out where they get stuck.

- Mental snare: stuck in your mind
- Emotional Snare: fear, disappointment, can't write about [fill in the blank]
- Spiritual Snare: writing is spiritual, an element of humanness
- Tactical Overwhelm Snare: so many ideas, logistics to creating a world, can bog you down

Writing is a conversation with yourself. Pitfalls of writing: Time: time is now. Purpose: redefine your purpose.


