10:58 AM – 11:55 AM: Our guest speaker was Kathy Cano-Murillo a Phoenix Latina artist, author, and content creator. She founded the award-winning site, CraftyChica.com. She is a former syndicated newspaper columnist and now a full-time creativepreneur and has authored a dozen books, including two novels and the best seller – *Forever Frida* (https://www.amazon.com/Forever-Frida-Celebration-Loves-Words/dp/1507210116.)

Highlights from Kathy's presentation: Kathy's mission is to promote positivity through creativity. Our members enjoyed Kathy's presentation, a woman of high energy, vibrant, funny, and hard-working who shared many tips on writing and publishing.

Kathy started at Arizona Republic as a shredder, then news assistant, then Features reporter. Wrote a Saturday craft column that ran in 130 papers, then authored the celebrity column. Started a blog, which led to Crafty Chica. Now working on her 3rd novel and several craft books.

- My opportunities in life happened because I didn't wait for perfection. All creativity comes from my place of passion.
- Your life have fun with it!
- I dared to dream big.
- Just start writing.
- True magic in your day-to-day experiences. Write immediately to preserve details (which disappear quick in memory).
- Learn discipline and speed. Try writing 500 words a day for 30 days.
- Write a book review or movie review. How does the book or movie make you feel?
- My website: I posted samples of many different types of writing. All my contacts started thru my website.
- Take those adverbs out!
- Outline start with an outline.
- Try writing the end of story first then write the rest of the story.
- Write every day. Don't overthink it. Set phone to 15 mins and write. Always delete the first paragraph, it's a warm up, like making the first pancake.
- Don't read. Don't edit. The story will change by the end. Characters MUST change/grow.
- Action Conflict Tension in every story.
- Every line or scene should move the story forward or be cut.
- When she started, there were 11 major publishers but now only 4 publishers. Very tough to get accepted.

Publishing: you can always issue a 2nd edition of a book if you want to change the story, the cover or

have an anniversary release. Can request rights to your already published book for a re-release.

- Amazon publishing: series of 2 or 3 works well.
- Traditional publisher: author has no say on cover art and at mercy of marketing dept.
- YouTube: great for learning about barcodes, formats and self-publishing.
- Recommends authorpreneur https://www.authorpreneur.com/
- Would not pay to publish.


